The Dayton Aviation Trail is a self-guided tour of selected, aviation-related sites open to the public. The Trail was established in 1981 by Aviation Trail, Inc., an all-volunteer, not-for-profit corporation whose mission is to preserve and promote the Dayton area's unique aviation heritage, starting with the invention of the airplane by Wilbur and Orville Wright. That heritage continues on to today's aerospace projects of the future now under development at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base.

In 1982 Aviation Trail, Inc. acquired two historic Wright brothers buildings still standing next to each other on their original sites in Dayton's West Side neighborhood: the Hoover Block and The Wright Cycle Company building. These eventually became the cornerstone of the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park, a park of four scattered sites managed by the National Park Service. The Trail group also completed in late 2010 the Aviation Trail Parachute Museum on the second floor of the Visitor Center which tells the story of the development of the free fall parachute from its invention at Dayton's McCook Field after World War I up to the vital role it plays in safely landing today's spacecraft.
